



#### Infrastructure

Damage to buildings, roads, reservoirs

- zebra mussels
- japanese knotweed





#### **Agriculture**

Up to 17% of production lost because of invasive species

Cause damage worth billions of Euros to the European economy every year.

## Health and social impacts

#### Health

- giant hogweed – skin irritation

#### Increase risk of flooding

- Signal crayfish undermining riverbanks
- Aquatic plants choking waterways

**Decline in particular species or habitats** -red squirrel









## Drivers of this project... Most likely measure to be successful Least costly option • Requires cooperation of a wide range of stakeholders **Prevention** Containment of established species • Damage-limitation measure • Risk of accidental release/spread Control Unlikely to be possible with an established species Very costly and complicated Eradication **Prevention** is the primary message

Education and Awareness are critical to prevention
