When do I have to apply?

The CAO opens during November 2022 for courses starting in September 2023.

The fee for an online application is currently €45. There is an online discounted fee of €30 if you apply before 20th January (17:00).

What courses are offered to Leaving Certificate Applicants?

You may apply via the CAO for any <u>first year Full-time undergraduate</u> course at ATU Sligo.

This means you may apply for:

- Higher Certificate (Level 6) (usually 2 Years)
- Ordinary Degree (Level 7) (usually 3 Years)
- Honours Degree (Level 8) (usually 3-4 Years)




What are the Entry Requirements for Leaving Certificate Applicants?



Grade and Subject Requirement:

Grades: How many Honours / Ordinary subjects do I need to apply for the course?

Subjects: What Leaving Certificate Subjects are required to apply?

Grade and Subject Requirement:

The Minimum entry requirements for applying for a Higher Certificate (Level 6) and Ordinary Degree (Level 7) are:

- 5 Leaving Cert. subjects @ grade O6/H7 or better
- Subjects must include either English or Irish.
- Minimum points score of 160 points
- Mathematics is a required subject in most cases. However, there are a few programmes for which Mathematics is not an entry requirement, and

some where a higher grade in maths is required. (See individual course descriptors.)

The entry requirements Honours Degree (Level 8) are:

6 leaving Certificate subjects

A minimum of two subjects at grade H5 or better

Remaining subjects at grade O6/H7 or better

Subjects must include either English or Irish.

Mathematics is a required subject in most cases. However, there are a few programmes for which Mathematics is not an entry requirement, and some where a higher grade in maths is required. (See individual course

descriptors)

Maths Requirement:

To be able to apply for Many ATU Sligo Courses, you must have passed certain subjects in your Leaving Certificate. Very often a specific grade in Mathematics is a requirement.

What if I don't have the Maths Requirement: "The Alternative Maths Exam"

IT Sligo usually holds an "Alternative Maths Exam" in August/September. The Exam is organised by IT Sligo to facilitate students who did not obtain the required minimum mathematics entry requirements for their chosen IT Sligo programmes.

Registration for the Mathematics exam usually opens up in June each year. Some details may be seen here:



Points requirement:

You must meet the CAO points requirements for the programme. Points are largely determined by the volume of applications received and the number of places available. Here is more information on how points are calculated for the Leaving Certificate.

Restricted Access Requirement:

Certain courses are Restricted-Application Courses, (such as Fine Art , Writing and Literature). They may have early assessment procedures which may start as early as February. You may need to complete a Portfolio, or an interview, or have an employer agreed (for work-based programmes)

Garda Vetting:

Some Courses require students to undertake work - placements which will bring them into contact with children and/or vulnerable adults.

Therefore, under National Vetting Bureau (Children and Vulnerable Persons)
Acts 2012 to 2016, registration on these programmes is conditional on
students successfully clearing the Student Vetting process.
